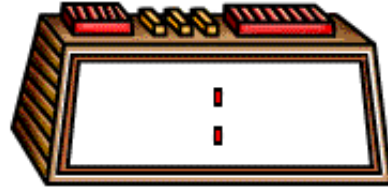


Bathtime: A Short Play

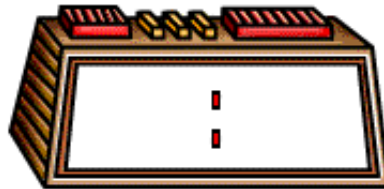
Group: "When's breakfast ready Mom?"
